Often times parents and caregivers feel isolated and frustrated as they struggle to raise their children. At our Family Resource Center, we provide them with the necessary skills and resources to grow a hopeful, healthy family.

We are sure you can remember times during your middle school years when you thought nothing was right in your life and you disliked the whole world. Since kids still feel that way, we have mentors and counselors in the schools to work with students to gain a more realistic perspective and sense of hope that things can and will change.

As you walk through the doors of our Mosaic Parenting Center, hope permeates throughout the house. It is why a mom who has been separated from her daughter works so hard with our coaches to develop a positive parenting relationship.

The children, adults, couple, and families who come to our Counseling Centers are gaining the necessary coping skills to manage their challenges. With our support, they begin to see a light at the end of the tunnel and hope just around the corner.

Children and their families continue to grapple with the effects of the pandemic and the escalating epidemic of anxiety, depression and trauma.

Through our Positive Youth Development Programs, we are meeting the ever-evolving needs of youth and families in our communities.

Our work with elementary, middle, and high school children in the town of West Hartford is both critical and transforming.

Positive Youth Development Programs Help Students Navigate Life's Challenges

Nearly five decades ago the town of West Hartford designated the Bridge Family Center as its Youth Service Bureau responsible for assessment, resource development, community involvement, and advocacy on behalf of children, youth, and families. Serving as the Youth Service Bureau, it is our job to engage with the community and tailor our services to the needs that arise. Our strong relationship with town leaders and school administrators allows us to continue to provide comprehensive prevention and intervention services for West Hartford students and parents.

The Bridge Family Center's Positive Youth Development programs are comprised of a constellation of services and activities for students in West Hartford inside and outside of the school. The programs focus on young peoples' strengths and offer them education, community, and opportunities to engage in new experiences. Examples include a school-based Boys Leadership group, the Prevention Skate Night event for middle school students, and the Teen Leadership Committee.

Youth need substantial structure and support from compassionate, safe adults to develop coping skills to manage life's complications. Our staff work to help students develop life skills including decision-making, communication, stress management, and a sense of positive self-regard so they feel empowered to navigate life independently. Over time, significant changes happen; behavior in the classroom improves, youth build healthy relationships, involvement and leadership in groups increases, and ability to mentor and share what they have learned with other students grows.

One of our long-standing community offerings is the West Hartford Teen Center, which continues to be a safe, substance-free space for teens. The Teen Center offers drop-in hours three days a week where teens can gather to socialize, play pool, basketball, video games, and engage with our mentoring staff as needed. The center also houses our Teen Leadership Committee which focuses on community service and program planning, and strives to support the youth's development of problem-solving and teambuilding skills. This year, thanks to the hard work and generosity of Camden-Grace Interiors, the Teen Center underwent a major transformation creating a fresh and vibrant room for our youth.






